

# How might you make two ways for Myra to travel to the mountains faster?
















# Each animal lives in a different niche but all need your help getting ready for the winter!



Beaver

#### Black Bear



Beavers are the second largest rodent in the world. As rodents, they have two front teeth (called incisors) which continue growing throughout their life. Beavers live primarily in water, and create wetlands by building wooden dams which block the flow of streams and rivers. They build their homes (or lodges) in the ponds that the dams create. They eat the inner bark of trees that grow near the water.

Black bears live in forests of North America. Despite their name, they can be black, brown, or cream colored. They are mostly vegetarian, but will also consume insects, fish, and as deer. Black bears fatten up in the fall and hibernate during winter when it is harder to find food. Hibernation is like a deep food. Hibernation is like a deep sleep during which they do not

eat, poop, or move.

Fox squirrels are large rodents which live in trees across North America. They eat many foods, including nuts, seeds, and insects. In the Fall, they will bury large numbers of nuts and other foods in locations (called caches) to prepare for the winter. They can jump up to fifteen feet as they navigate the treetops.
